Resilience Innovations and Carbon Financing and Carbon Market in the Asia Pacific

Background

Confronted by sustainable development-related challenges, countries have aligned themselves in their commitment to implement different global agenda such as the Sustainable Development Goals, Paris Agreement, New Urban Agenda, and Sendai Framework which oriented them towards solutions to development challenges. This global agenda – to make them more meaningful and to provide better outcomes - must be translated into innovative local strategies.

Cities are the biggest causes and bearers of climate change, therefore the real and innovative actions are needed in cities. Climate change is a Global challenge, but requires local actions (Global Challenges, Local actions).

Developing innovation strategies require local leaders to think in a strategic and systematic manner so as not to waste time and resources. City leaders who are working towards climate change adaptation and mitigation must be receptive enough to tackle the nuances of the challenges in today's current disruptive world, characterized by volatility, uncertainty, complexity.

Moreover, the post-COVID 19 scenario raises further questions and creates new layers on the challenges as to how we can develop new ways of out-of-the-box strategic management, develop new capacities, and new collaboration for addressing climate change issues.

Climate Leadership Program

The Climate Leadership Program is an exclusive series of leadership and technical learning series that aims to increase the capacities of climate change practitioners in the Asia Pacific with the end view of helping them transform their communities while addressing impacts of climate change. This is jointly organized by CityNet and Jakarta Capital City Government with potential partners along the process.

This activity is also a global peer-based exchange of best practices of both innovative national and local climate actions. It will provide a regional platform for further knowledge exchanges of practical tools and tried-and-tested processes for the development of sustainable urban solutions to mitigate impacts of climate change.

The general objectives of this workshop:

1. To learn and familiarize basic leadership and problem solving approaches using systems design thinking while analyzing climate-related and the post covid-19 challenges;

2. To exchange information and insights on emerging global trends, regional situations on climate change, private sector-led opportunities, local innovations and sustainable urban solutions relative to low carbon and understanding the potential of project Carbon finance and Carbon Market Mechanism
3. To present different strategies city governments are implementing relative to financing climate adaptation and mitigation activities.
4. To learn on the different prototypes on climate change solutions and build further conversations as to how they can scale up and raise the prospect of replications to other countries;
5. To identify action plans and develop further prospects on sustainable city to city cooperation using different CityNet and other regional platforms.

Target Participants

City mayors, senior city managers, urban planners, environmental officers and key urban leaders and decision makers from public, private and civil society sectors.

A general screening application process will be conducted to ensure the quality of the participation and outcome. At least, CityNet is expecting 30-50 international participants for each webinar.

- Discussion and Insights –Participants will be able to consolidate learnings and generate reflections on the program
